### Am I eligible for certification?

To be eligible for initial certification, at the time of application you must

- hold a current, unrestricted license to practice medicine in the United States, its territories, or in Canada
- conform to HMDCB's Code of Professional Conduct
- demonstrate a minimum of 400 hours of broad hospice-related activities\* during the previous 5 years
- qualify for at least one of HMDCB's eligibility pathways.

\*Hospice-related activities are defined as activities within the hospice setting as outlined in the content blueprint (e.g., engagement in IDG, patient care, certification process, medication management, participating in performance improvement, and administrative activities).
